WARM-UP QUESTIONS:

1. How do you generally feel about getting together with your family (immediate and extended)? Do you find these gatherings enjoyable or stressful?
2. Are there any taboo topics around your dinner table?
3. Most of us have to meet and interact with others at some point during our day. Given this, are intentional gatherings necessary?

REFLECTION QUESTIONS:

1. What has communion meant to you? What does it symbolize? How is the table to be a shared and open experience for all who realize and remember what Jesus has done for them?
2. Read 1 Corinthians 11:23-26 together keeping in mind the act of gathering together is a sacrament. How does this change the meaning for you?
3. Pastor Jason states that the early Christians were constantly encouraged to connect their faith with their relationships in the church (see Hebrews 10:23-25). What did this look like?

APPLICATION QUESTIONS:

1. Having experienced this fall sermon series, how has your understanding and attitude towards our church as family been impacted or changed?
2. What is God has put on your heart for our church family? What are some of your hopes? What are some concerns? Take time to share and pray together.
