

"A logical starting point for churches that want to build greater intergenerational warmth is one of our most basic, but profound, community practices: praying for one another."







And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly. <sup>32</sup> All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had.





45 They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. <sup>46</sup> Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, 47 praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

## PHILIPPIAN BENEDICTION




