WALK WITH US-LITERALLY OR FIGURATIVELY

Los Angeles

In the past year, more than 10,000 hospitality workers won a protracted fight for wages and working conditions that will allow them to live where they work. Week after week, CLUE members joined with workers at delegations to management, and city council meetings.

When the chips were down, they joined with thousands on Century Boulevard to call attention to the plight of workers, many risking arrest at the largest act of nonviolent civil disobedience in decades in So Cal.

Work continues to expand living wages for all tourism workers, as well as public service workers and others.
